Pastoral Letter

Dear Siblings in Christ,

Greetings on this very rainy day in April! As the rain falls, images of morel mushrooms, fresh spring flowers and thriving garden plants fill my mind, with the hope of growth from seeds I have sown. At CSUMC, we are seeing the fruit of seeds sown months ago, and I look forward to celebrating some of these in worship on June 2, as we commemorate several projects planned by Trustees and funded by Memorial gifts.

One of these projects is the commissioning of a new cross and flame for our south wall, created by local artist Steve Anderson. If you have not had a chance to see it, I encourage you to come take a look! As this project was coming to fruition, some questions about design and history came up, and I want to share some of the story of our church symbol.

Our denomination was formed in 1968, as a merger of The Methodist Church and the Evangelical United Brethren. Neither denomination had a particular trademark, so the opportunity to create a new one was embraced with enthusiasm. Edward J. Mikula, educated at the Chicago Institute of Art, was selected as art director, and Edwin H. Maynard, well versed in Christian symbolism and theology, was named editorial director. These two decided the design had to be simple and elegant, to draw attention and immediate recognition, and they came up with two dozen designs, eventually narrowing them down to two.

The one we know so well holds two symbols: the cross and flame: the cross as a symbol of Christianity, Christ's sacrifice, and the Wesleyan call to service; the flame as a symbol of the Holy Spirit, Pentecost, and Wesley's personal experience of the Holy Spirit, as his heart was "strangely warmed." The two tongues of flame can represent the two denominations coming together in one Spirit. The second-place design also included a globe representing God as Creator and the church's world-wide mission.

The cross and flame quickly became a beloved denominational emblem. It is rich with meaning and prevalent on buildings, road signs, and publications. I remember my first UMC Youth sweatshirt with the cross and flame...the first time I became aware of its meaning. As we enjoy the new cross and flame on our building, and perhaps notice the others we pass by in our daily lives, let us be encouraged to live more boldly into our call as United Methodists to open our hearts, our minds, and our doors as enthusiastic participants in the work of the Holy Spirit making disciples of Jesus Christ for the transformation of the world.






